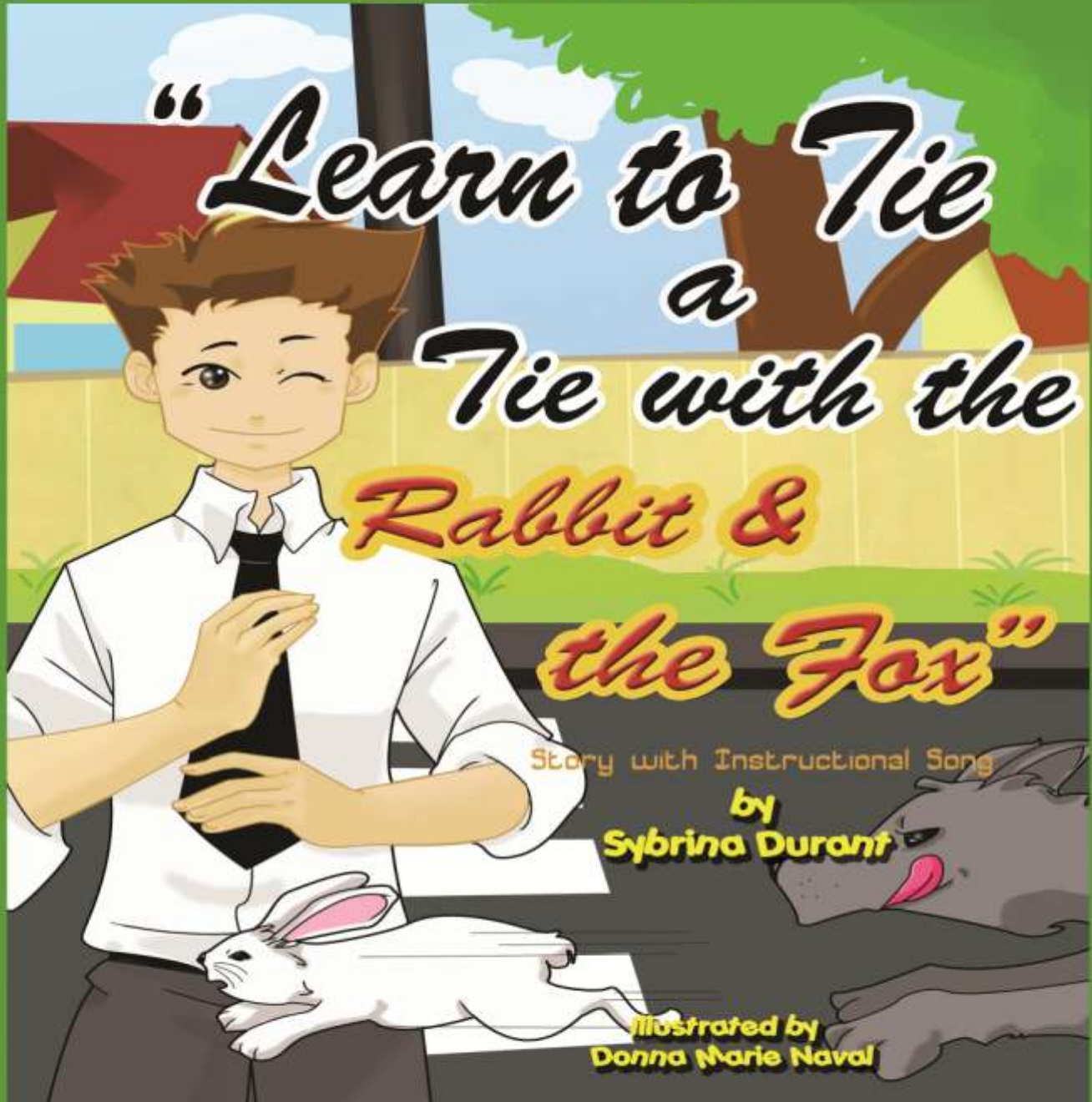


The following pages are an electronic rendition of the actual paperback gift book for boys in the wedding party.



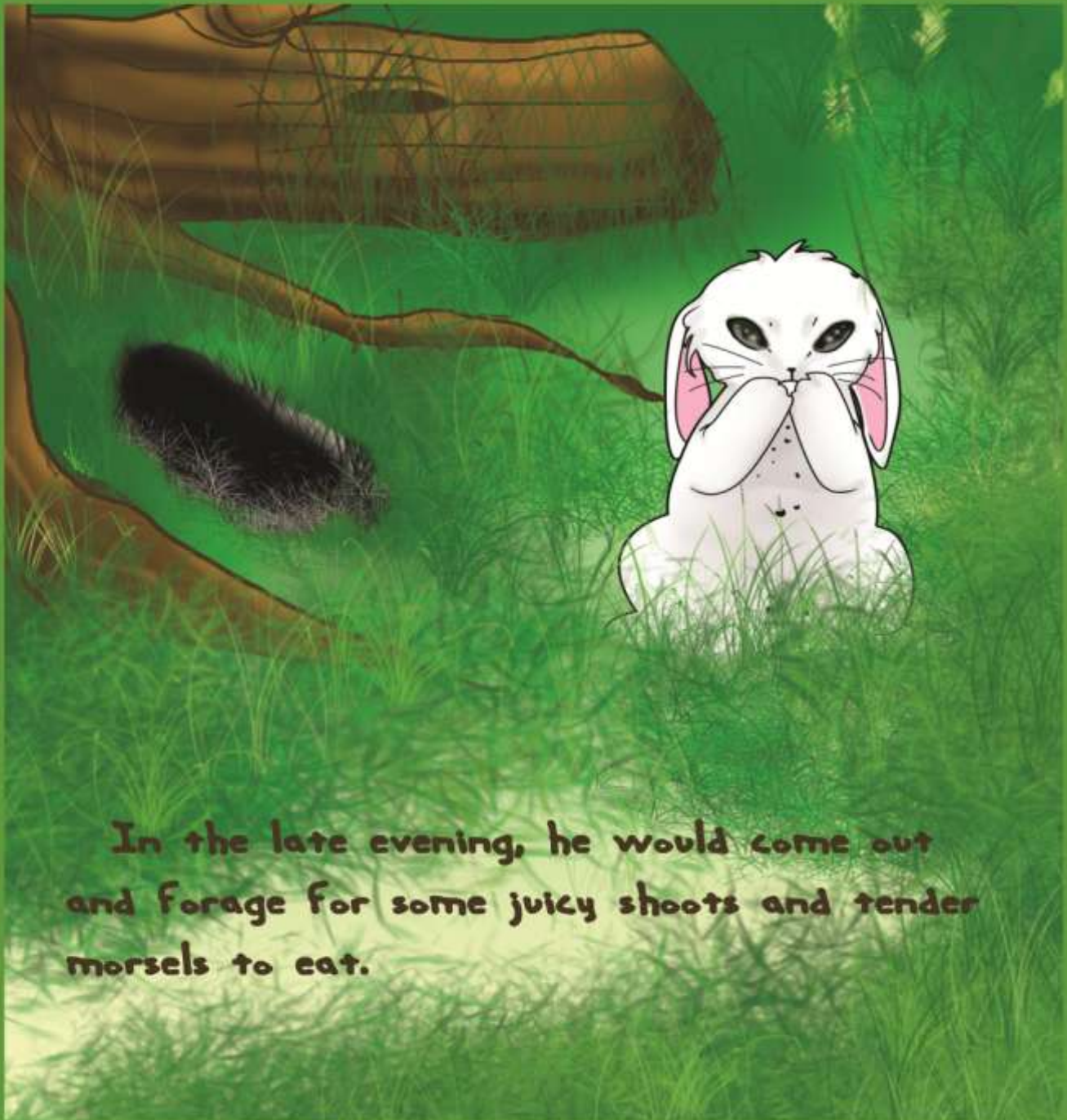

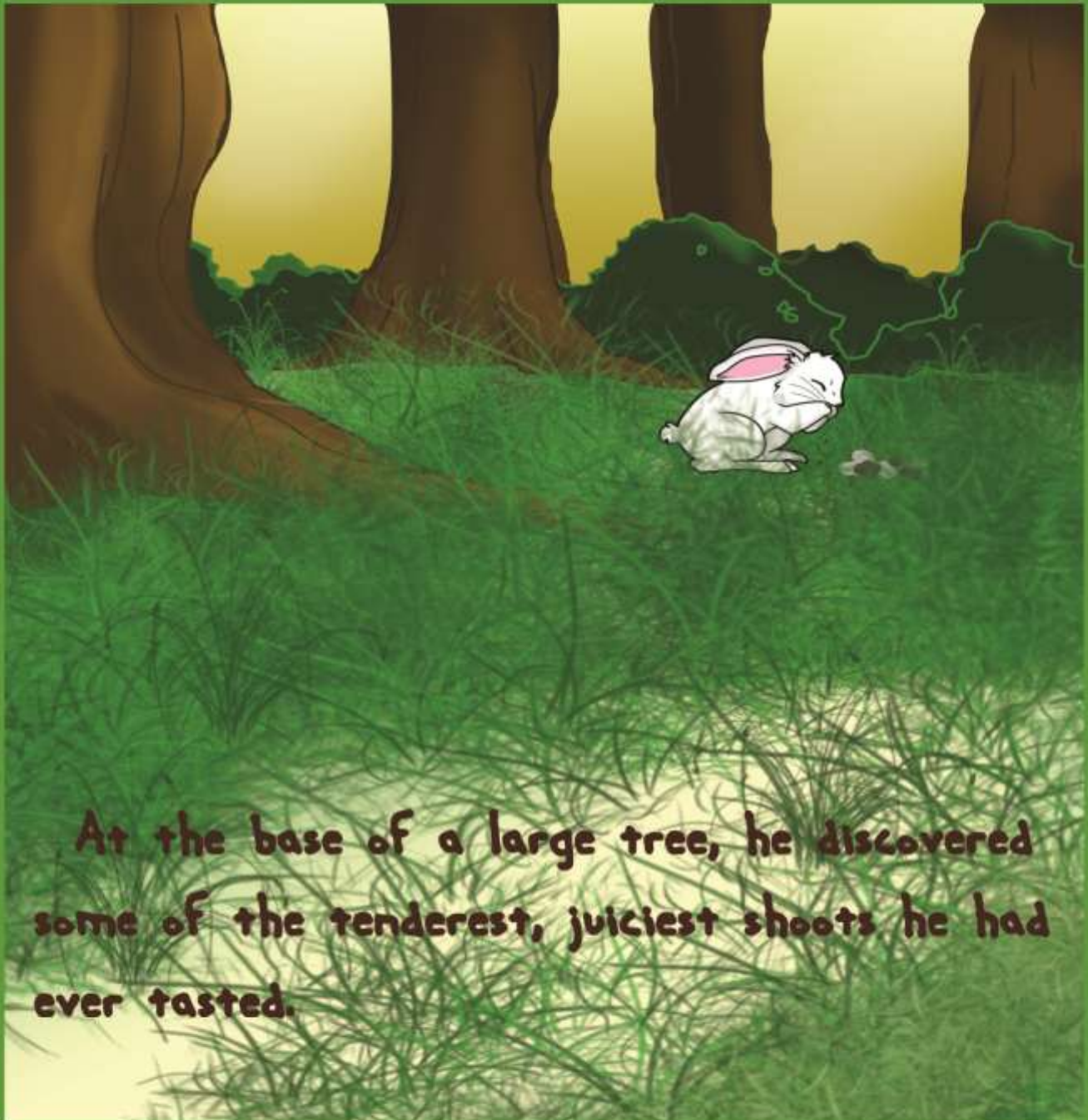
The Little Rabbit enjoyed sleeping in that nice, cozy place, far from the rays of the blazing sun.

For a moment, the Little Rabbit froze, his tiny heart pounding like a big fist in his chest.....



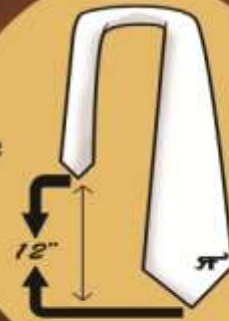


He stood still as a statue as a quick gray fox surveyed the possibilities of having a tender rabbit for his own dinner.

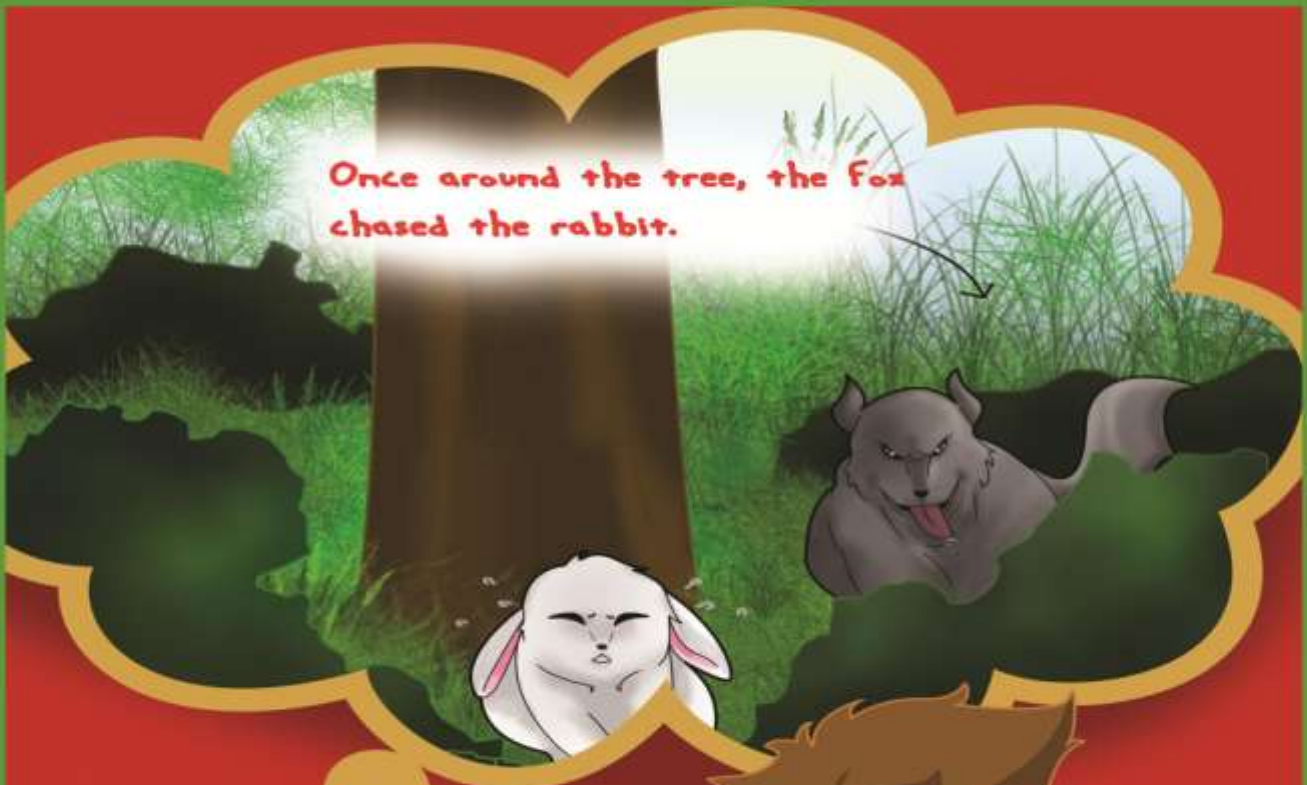
Gathering his senses about him,

Repeat the last step.

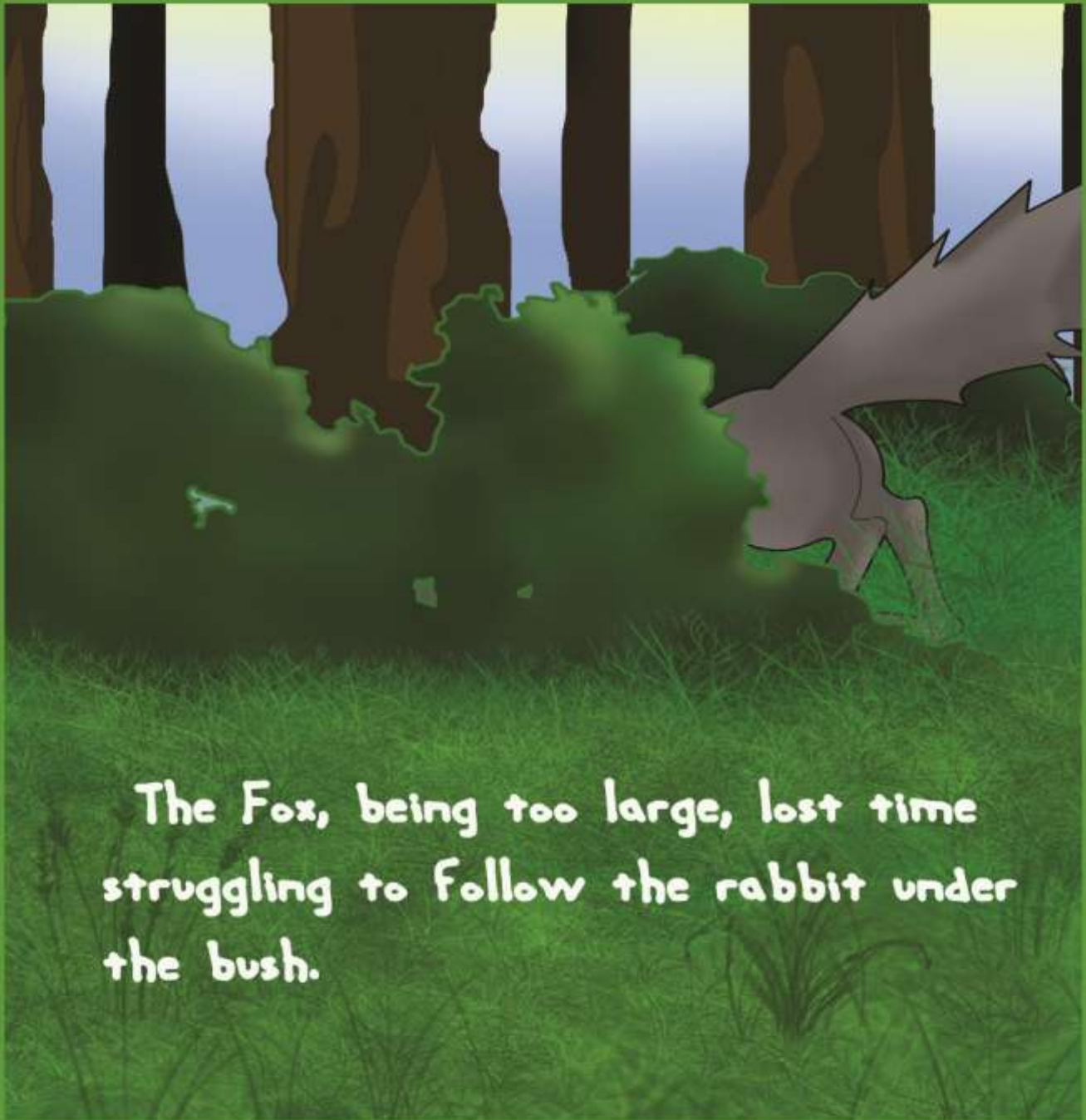


Trying to shake the persistent Fox,

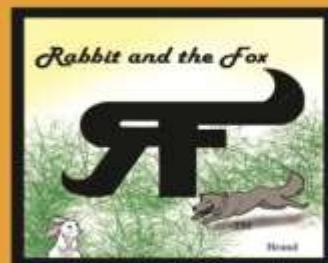
**There you have it! In 6 easy steps, you'll look like this guy.**

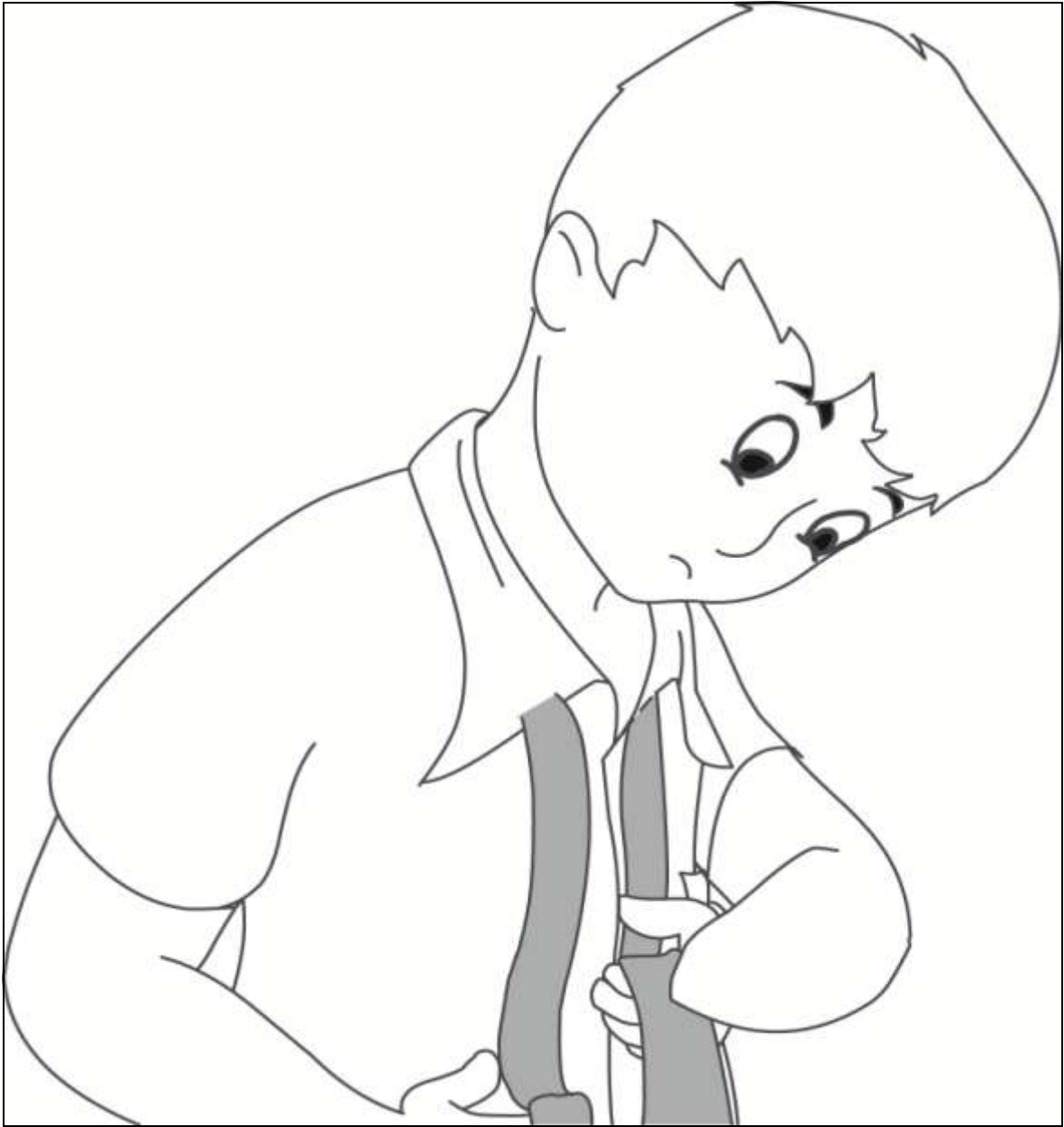
